GENERAL INFORMATION

which is linked through a private exchange to all Departments.

The depots are under the supervision of the Goods Agent, Mr. J. W. Ruse, whose office is at Christian Road Goods Depot.

The following is a list of extensions on the private branch exchange from which information on rates, transit, cartage, warehousing, etc., can be readily obtained:-

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The following depots in the Preston area are under the supervision of the Goods Agent, Preston, the facilities available at each depot being shown below:-

Christian Road .. Specially adapted for the handling of sundries traffic

.. Traffic in full truck loads (consignments of I ton and over for one consignee) comprising goods, minerals, railway containers and warehouse traffic

A gantry crane, 20-ton capacity, is provided to deal with heavy traffic. An end-on loading dock is available to facilitate handling of motor cars,

Warehouse accommodation is available for storage of cotton, grain, feeding stuffs and foodstuffs

CARTAGE

The cartage fleet based on Christian Road and Butler Street provides an extensive collection and delivery service in the town, both for sundries and full load traffic.

TOWN CARTAGE

In the course of their normal goods collection and delivery services in Preston, British Railways operate a Town Cartage service, whereby merchandise is collected from a Trader's premises and delivered to any address in the town.

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OVERSEAS AND CONTINENTAL SERVICES

British Railways, through the District Goods Manager's Organisation in Warrington, are participants in the arrangements concerning the carriage of goods by rail agreed under the Berne Convention.

In principle, this provides for through consigning of goods by a single transport document covering the whole distance from Preston to destination via the British Transport Commission's rail and steamer services and European Railways by all principal routes.

ASSOCIATED HUMBER LINES LTD.

An official agency with commercial representation is also operated on behalf of Associated Humber Lines Ltd. who have direct sailings between Hull and Goole to France, Belgium, Holland, Germany and Denmark, catering for traffic to all European countries—whereby quotations of rates and documentation can be arranged for the carriage of merchandise and passengers to and from the near Continent.

AGREED FLAT RATES

British Railways are willing in suitable cases to negotiate Agreed Flat Rates with traders, whereby an average charge per ton or per package can be ascertained, which is equitable to both trader and railways.

The basis of the Agreed Flat Rate is broadly the average transport cost to the trader during a representative period.

The scheme is designed to provide a simplified charging system, and by avoiding the checking of separately charged consignments, effects a saving in clerical cost to the trader.

Request for Agreed Flat Rates should be made to the Goods Agent, Christian Road.

CREDIT FACILITIES

British Railways are at all times willing to open credit accounts with established traders who have a regular traffic conveyed by rail, where the volume warrants the facility.

Application for credit facilities should be made to the Goods Agent, Christian Road.

ROAD/RAIL CONTAINERS

Since the railway container was first introduced, the principle has been extended and elaborated to cater for a vast range of traffics from meat to machinery, from textiles to tractors. The container is, in effect, the demountable body of a railway truck or road vehicle, and being a separate unit from the chassis, may be carried by rail, road or sea.

The main advantages are in a door-to-door service, elimination of intermediate handling, minimised risk of damage, and reduction in packing costs.

A comprehensive illustrated folder, "Road-Rail Containers—Door-to-Door Transport," showing the types for particular traffics, with dimensions and cubic capacity, will be supplied on request to the Goods Agent.

STORAGE FACILITIES RAILHEAD DEPOTS SITES FOR WORKS PRIVATE SIDINGS

The advantages of easy accessibility to railway facilities are obvious, and application for accommodation in or near railway goods yards should be made to the District Goods Manager, Warrington.

COMMERCIAL REPRESENTATION

It is the constant endeavour of British Railways to make their services more efficient by full co-operation with the public, industry and commerce, and liaison is maintained by the Goods Agent and an outdoor Commercial Representative.

COLLICO CASES

British Railways, in conjunction with Collico Ltd., have introduced a scheme under which traders can hire on a monthly basis collapsible steel or alloy cases for the conveyance of their products by rail.

The hire charges include the cost of rail transit of the cases (tare weight) outwards when loaded and also the return of the empty cases collapsed flat to hirer.

The advantages of the scheme to traders include:-

- (I) Elimination of cost of cartons and timber
- (2) Simplification of work of packers
- (3) Saving in storage space
- (4) Added measure of security and reduction in insurance costs
- (5) Mislaid cases can be speedily traced

PARCELS TRAFFIC

A fleet of parcels vans operate in Preston collecting and delivering passenger train parcels traffic. Speedy rail services are available to all parts of the country.

Details of rates and charges for the conveyance of parcels traffic can be obtained from Preston station.

WORKS AND PARTY OUTINGS

British Railways can arrange Works and Party Outings. Special quotations are given which include travel, meals and sight-seeing tours. A representative will call upon you if you telephone Preston 4821.
